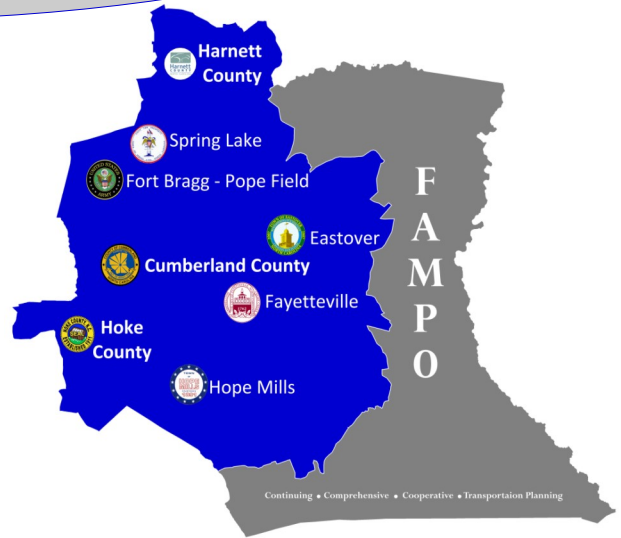

### Project Update: NC 24/87/210 Bragg Blvd. U-4444B in Spring Lake

See page 3 for a conceptual illustration of the proposed overpass.



U-4444B is the section of NC 210 (Murchison Rd) and NC 24/87 (Bragg Blvd), that stretches from the Fort Bragg Boundary to North of NC 24/87/210 in Spring Lake. Right of way acquisition is currently in progress.

The purpose of the project is to improve the safety and more efficiently accommodate the existing and projected increase in traffic on this section of roadway through the Town of Spring Lake. Originally, this project had a negative side-effect of making it harder for vehicles and pedestri-

ans in Spring Lake to cross Bragg Boulevard.

Together, The Town of Spring Lake, FAMPO, and the North Carolina Department of Transportation worked to develop a solution that will link the Main Street side of Spring Lake with the East side of town. The entire project is scheduled to be let for construction in June 2012.

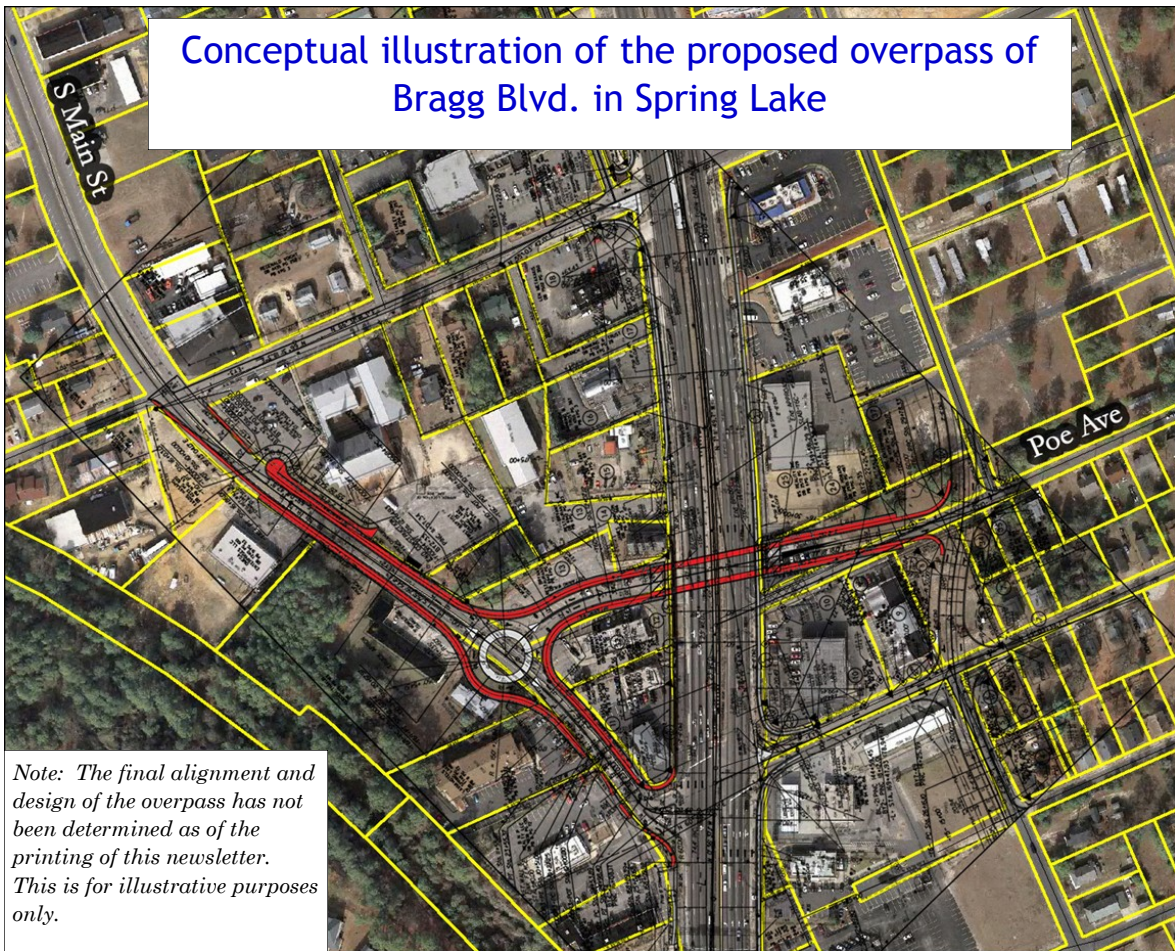
