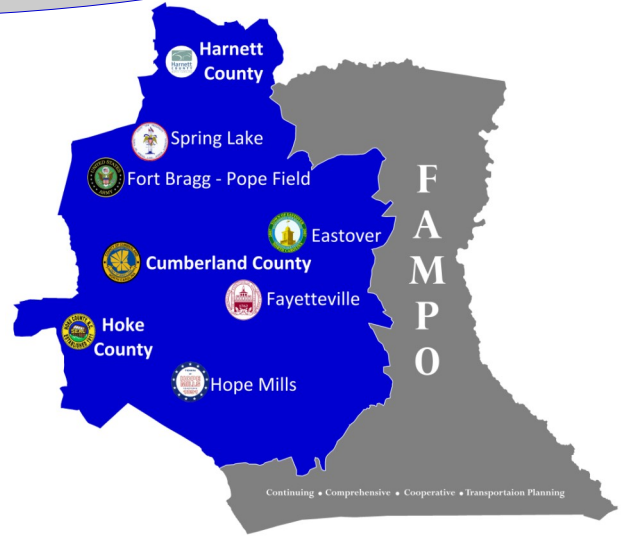

### Bicycle and Pedestrian Connectivity Report and Cross Creek Greenway Update

The Bicycle and Pedestrian Connectivity Report has been finalized and is available for review at our website, [www.fampo.org](http://www.fampo.org). The Transportation Advisory Committee approved the plan at their April 20th meeting.

With the help of Stewart Engineering, NCDOT, and the City of Fayetteville, we will now begin work on the second part of the study, which includes designing a greenway along either Little Cross Creek or Big Cross Creek. The proposed greenway will be similar to the Cape Fear River Trail, and will connect many



neighborhoods to attractions along the way. The proposed greenway will traverse the city for about 7.5 miles from Veteran's Park downtown to Fort Bragg. A map of the proposed alternatives is available for review at our website, where you can also take a short survey on transportation issues in our area. 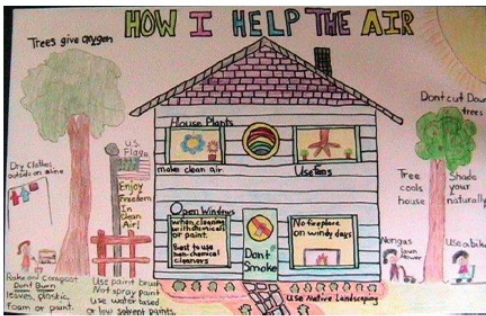

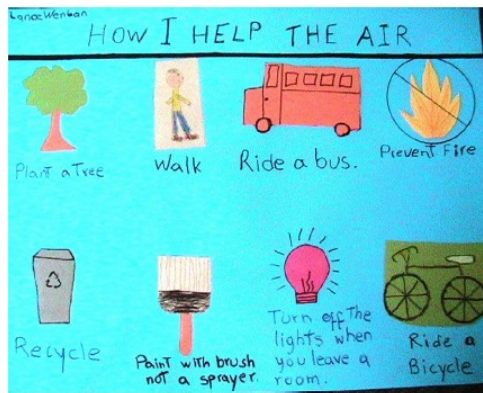

## Air Quality Update



Ozone season began on April 1 and runs through October 31. During the ozone season there is a daily air quality forecast to alert people of the Air Quality Index. The Air Quality Index is color coded so people know how air impacts daily activity. Ozone is dangerous to human health, and can aggravate existing conditions in sensitive
