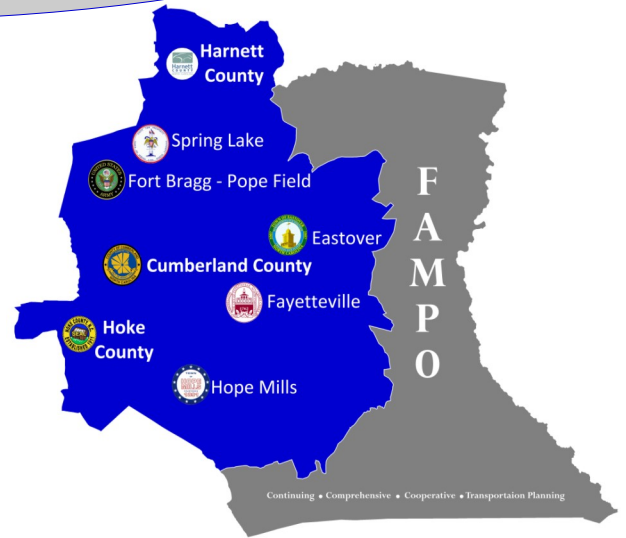

FAMPO Draft 2012-2018 Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program (MTIP)



On July 7th, 2011 the North Carolina Board of Transportation adopted the 2012-2018 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). The STIP is a document that prioritizes and schedules all of the major transportation projects throughout the entire State. You can view the STIP at www.ncdot.org/~tip.

FAMPO's portion of the STIP is called the Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program, or MTIP, and will be available for public review from October 5th through October

25th. You can visit the FAMPO offices at 130 Gillespie Street in Fayetteville to review a hard copy of the MTIP, or view it online at www.fampo.org. The Transportation Advisory Committee, FAMPO's policy Board, will take action on the MTIP at a public hearing on October 26th at 8:30am at the Historic Courthouse Hearing Room #3 at 130 Gillespie Street.

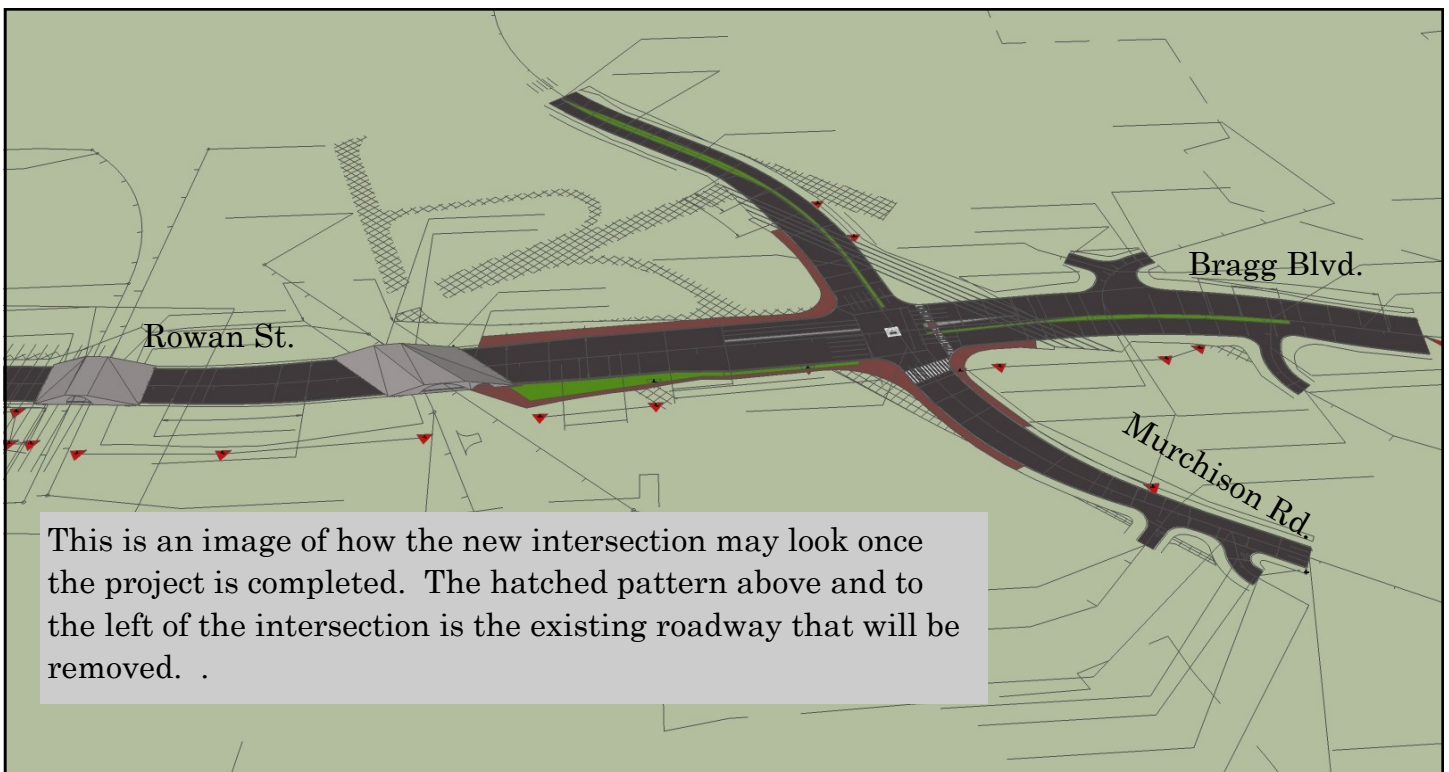

B-4490 Rowan Street Bridge Replacement

Bridge No. 116 which is also known as the Rowan Street bridge is currently scheduled for replacement. This bridge allows vehicle traffic to travel over CSX Railroad, Norfolk Southern Railroad, and Hillsboro Street. The project will include realigning Rowan Street, Bragg Boulevard, and Murchison Road to connect all these roadways at one intersection. The Right-of-Way acquisition is currently scheduled for December 2013 and Construction for December 2015. The current bridge will be replaced with two smaller bridges, one over the railroad tracks and one over Hillsboro Street, to achieve the desired results. FAMPO, the City of Fayetteville, and NCDOT are working together to make sure this project is designed in a context sensitive manner with accommodations made for pedestrians and bicyclists as well. This project will allow for the implementation of vital bicycle and pedestrian crossings that will connect planned greenways with the NC Veterans Park and the downtown area.



Air Quality Update

The Environmental Protection Agency, following the recommendation of its scientific advisors, had proposed that the standards for ground-level ozone become stricter. Stricter standards would have placed new emissions controls on businesses as well as transportation construction. In September 2011, the Obama administration announced that the new standard would not be set until 2013 when the current standards are

scheduled to be reconsidered. If new, stricter standards were imposed now, some argue that it would cost billions of dollars and hundreds of thousands of jobs. Even though a new standard will not be set now, we must continue to do our part and take steps to improve our air quality. Fayetteville Outer Loop Update

On September 7, 2011 Governor Beverly Purdue announced a new plan to accelerate urban loop projects in six North Carolina cities. This plan moves critical transportation projects forward faster while sustaining and creating jobs.

According to the Federal Highway Administration, every \$1 million spent on transportation creates 30 jobs, and according to the construction industry, every dollar invested in transportation generates \$6 in economic impact. The acceleration plan uses Grant Anticipation Revenue Vehicle, or GARVEE bonds, to advance the construction of the

Fayetteville Outer Loop. Construction of the Fayetteville Outer Loop from I-95 to All-American Freeway should be complete by State Fiscal Year 2016. The section from I-95 to US 401 is currently open.

Construction on the Outer Loop between Ramsey Street and Murchison Road began in April and is expected to be open to travel in 2015. The section between Bragg Boulevard and Murchison road should also be open to travel by 2015.
