PUBLIC NOTICE

The Public is invited to review the **FY 2009-2015 Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program** (MTIP) for the Fayetteville Metropolitan Area. Citizens' comments regarding the MTIP are welcomed.

The Transportation Improvement Program is a document in which local governments designate specific transportation improvements within the metropolitan areas. These projects address highway construction, bridge replacement, safety improvements, bicycle and pedestrian programs, transit needs, aeronautics and special transportation needs of the elderly and physically disadvantaged.

In accordance with the 2005 Safe Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: a Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU), the Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program contains a prioritized list of projects and a financial plan that demonstrates how the MTIP will be implemented. Projects are listed sequentially for each category. Federal-Aid projects included in the MTIP are part of the State Transportation Improvement Program.

The Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program will be available for public review and comments at the Fayetteville Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (FAMPO) offices from **July 8 to July 22, 2008** during regular office hours (8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.). The document is also available through FAMPO's web site at <http://www.fampo.org/>.

The FAMPO offices are located in the Historic Courthouse at 130 Gillespie Street, 2nd floor room 205.

The FAMPO Transportation Advisory Committee will hold a **public hearing** on **July 23, 2008, at 8:30 am** in the LaFayette Room, **City Hall** at 433 Hay Street, to receive citizens' comments regarding the MTIP for the Fayetteville Urbanized Area.
